


5280 Fast-track Cities Task Force: Ending the HIV Epidemic in Metro Denver

HIV in Metro Denver: 2018 Update

Key Findings

- HIV diagnoses in Metro Denver decreased in 2018 after two years of increases.
- 40% individuals with new HIV diagnoses in 2018 were Hispanic (any race).
- Engagement in care continues to be the biggest challenge to reaching the 90-90-90 targets for 2020.




HIV Diagnoses, 2018, Adams, Arapahoe, Denver, Douglas, Jefferson Counties
